Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our Lady of La Leche and Us

This Sunday October 10th will go down as a most important date in the history of the Diocese of St. Augustine as well as the long and continuous presence of the gospel in Northeast Florida. Having been postponed from last year 2020 as the Diocese marked 150 years of establishment, because of the pandemic, this day witnesses the canonical coronation of Our Lady of La Leche, a feast of the Diocese of St. Augustine.

As Bishop Estevez wrote back in 2013, "From the time that Spanish explorers established the town of St. Augustine, Fla. In 1565, they brought with them a particular devotion to the Blessed Mother of our Lord Jesus Christ. On September 8 of that year, the first Mass was celebrated on these shores – the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Later, a special devotion to *Nuestra Senora de La Leche y Buen Parto* – Our Lady of the Milk and Happy Delivery also began. Since the 17th century, this devotion has been kept alive by countless people of faith, especially as they seek our Blessed Lady's intercession for a safe delivery of their child."

We join our brothers and sisters throughout the diocese in celebrating this special and maternal event and continue to pray for our Mother's intercession. It is also auspicious that, on this Sunday one of our parishes celebrates her patronal feast day. October 7th is the memorial of our Lady of the Rosary after whom Holy Rosary parish is named. Apart from it being a feast day celebration we also continue events marking the centennial of the parish established back in 1921.

Last month we also celebrated the centennial of another of our tri-parish, St. Pius V. Pope St. Pius V was a great devotee of the rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose intercession was very powerful and remains so in the history of the church. Mary of course was at the foot of the cross as her son Jesus was crucified. So, for our three parishes, we can easily in short order identify Mary's role in their stories. Hence, every honor to Mary is indeed special for us.

Given the moment that we are in, historically speaking, this crowning of our Lady of La Leche is very important for one more reason. The image of La Leche is one of nourishment, protection and care for her child. As Mary magnificently along with Joseph played that role even up to the cross of Jesus, let us continue to implore her intercession in guiding our parishes and our families in the ways of faith and of promoting God's kingdom in our communities.

This event is one in a lifetime opportunity, and I would encourage everyone to see the livestream on our communication devices – smartphones, tablets, laptops, etc. We will most likely not see another in our lifetimes. May the powerful intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the title of Our Lady of La Leche remain our portion. Amen.
