Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today, in this space, there is more on the synod and themes for our overall understanding and prayerful reflection. The three items, which are of great importance, will always be in the background as we walk together over the next weeks and months. Let us continue to pray for a fruitful ethical process.

Communion

"In this way it becomes possible to build *communion* amid disagreement, but this can only be achieved by those great persons who are willing to go beyond the surface of the conflict and to see others in their deepest dignity" *Evangelii Gaudium* 228

- Prayer cannot be stressed enough!
- Communion with God and with others
- Listening to Holy Spirit in one's heart and then listening to Him speak through the voices of others
- Sharing the fruits of prayer strengthens *communion* when it's listened to by others
- Prayerful listening is "more than simply hearing"
- Attitude of Humility Everyone has something to learn

Participation

"Lay people are, put simply, the vast majority of the People of God. The minority – ordained ministers – are at their service" – Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 102.

- The participation of the laity will help "make pastoral decisions which correspond as closely as possible to God's will"
- Not always the same as public or majority opinion
- Attend one of the *Evenings of Discernment* for small group discussion to: Pray, Listen, Dialogue, Discern, and Advise.
- The prayerful convictions of the entire People of God will help form "practical conclusions" for the Continental and Universal Phases. This will ultimately bear fruit and enrich each local church.

Mission

"Mere administration" can no longer be enough. Throughout the world, let us be "permanently in a state of mission" – Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, 25.

- A formal teaching document will provide a universal plan of action centered on synodality to be implemented in each local church.
- Everyone (laity, pastors, Bishop of Rome) is called to "pastoral conversion"
- A Church which listens can evangelize those on the peripheries of our communities, parishes, and diocese.
- This helps form a culture of encounter becoming a more effective and credible witness to the truth of Christ in the Third Millennium

STEWARDSHIP AWARENESS SUNDAY

"And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices.' (Mark 12:33)

Of all the gifts that God gives us, the one He wants the most is our heart. He wants us to share out of our love for Him, not out of obligation. There are many symbols used to represent the Holy Spirit: water – which signifies the Holy Spirit's action in Baptism -- anointing, fire, a cloud and light, a seal, a hand, a finger, and a dove -- which is the form in which it descended upon Christ at His Baptism and which is traditionally used in Christian iconography.
